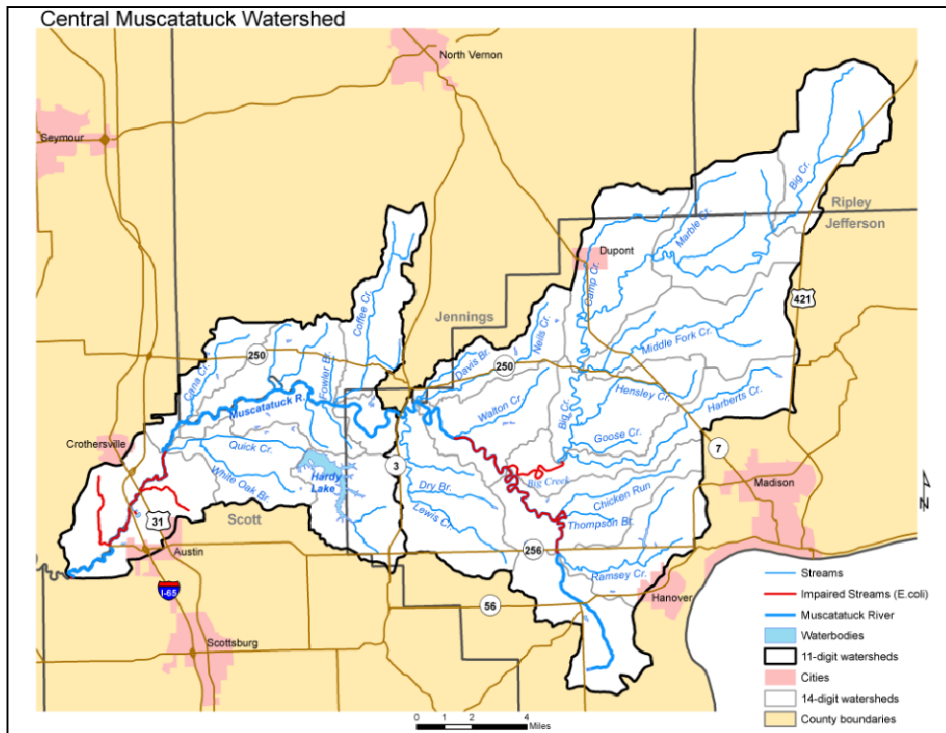


Central Muscatatuck Watershed Project

The Central Muscatatuck Creek Watershed project is a regional initiative in southeastern Indiana working to improve water quality and the quality of living in a five county area including Jackson, Jefferson, Jennings, Ripley and Scott counties. A watershed is simply an area of land that catches water and sheds it off into a creek, river, wetland, lake, or the ground water. So basically all of our towns, farms, houses, parking lots, forests, and much more make up our watershed.
